Two-week campaign to commemorate World Press Freedom Day 2021 under the global theme of “Information as a public good”

Phnom Penh, April 26, 2021 – Cambodia’s Free Press Working Group (FPWG) which consists of 13 local media organizations, associations and civil society organizations will co-organize a two-week online campaign aimed at highlighting the importance and encouraging public participation in promoting press freedom.

This online campaign will start from April 26 until May 10, 2021 to commemorate the World Press Freedom Day under the global theme of “Information as a public good”. During this campaign, some activities will be carried out by the member organizations of the FPWG and stakeholders, as well as the participation of all members of the public.
